Dear family and friends,

“We can close this year with gratitude and we look forward to 2022 with hope, confidence and desire.” This is how we concluded our December newsletter from last year. Now, almost three months later, you are already reading our next newsletter. We are discontinuing Butterfly's regular activities. In this latest newsletter we tell you why we decided to do this and we look back on the nine years that we have been able to do this work.

Why are we stopping?

In our December newsletter you could read about our ins and outs in the past year. It was a pretty tough year for both of us, which demanded a lot from us. In addition, our role as 'leaders' of Butterfly with the limitations that corona entailed also demanded a lot from us. We notice that it is becoming increasingly difficult for us to maintain or regain our resilience. Of course, our age also plays a role. We have therefore decided, in consultation with ECM, to discontinue Butterfly's structural activities with effect from March 1st. This gives us the opportunity to slow down a bit. Now that we have made this decision, we want to look back with you on the years that we were allowed to do this work.

How it started

Years ago, we had a desire to do 'something missional'. However the question always was: Yes, but how? You can become proficient and learn the material, but being patient and listening to God's voice and the

situations in which He puts you is also important.

The tipping point for us came in February 2013, when we both lost our jobs within a fortnight. We took a sabbatical for the rest of the year, went on an internship to England and formally started a missional initiative in January 2014 under the name Butterfly. We tried to put into practice the principles of 3DM from Sheffield (GB), propagated in our country by Nederland Zoekt.

The basis of this lies in the formation of missional communities where discipleship is central. According to the command that Jesus gave to his followers when he left: disciples who make disciples, who in turn also make disciples. And from there trying to make the connection with people in our neighbourhood or network.

How it went

We started building a community with confidence. We coached the participants through huddles and sought connection with lonely and broken people in our village in various ways.

It soon became apparent that it was not easy to put the theory into practice. The community stopped after a year and we chose to continue just the two of us. Martha visited prostitutes in Leeuwarden, we organized courses, held Alphas, and invited lonely people to our fortnightly Open House. We also huddled others on discipleship and prophecy.
